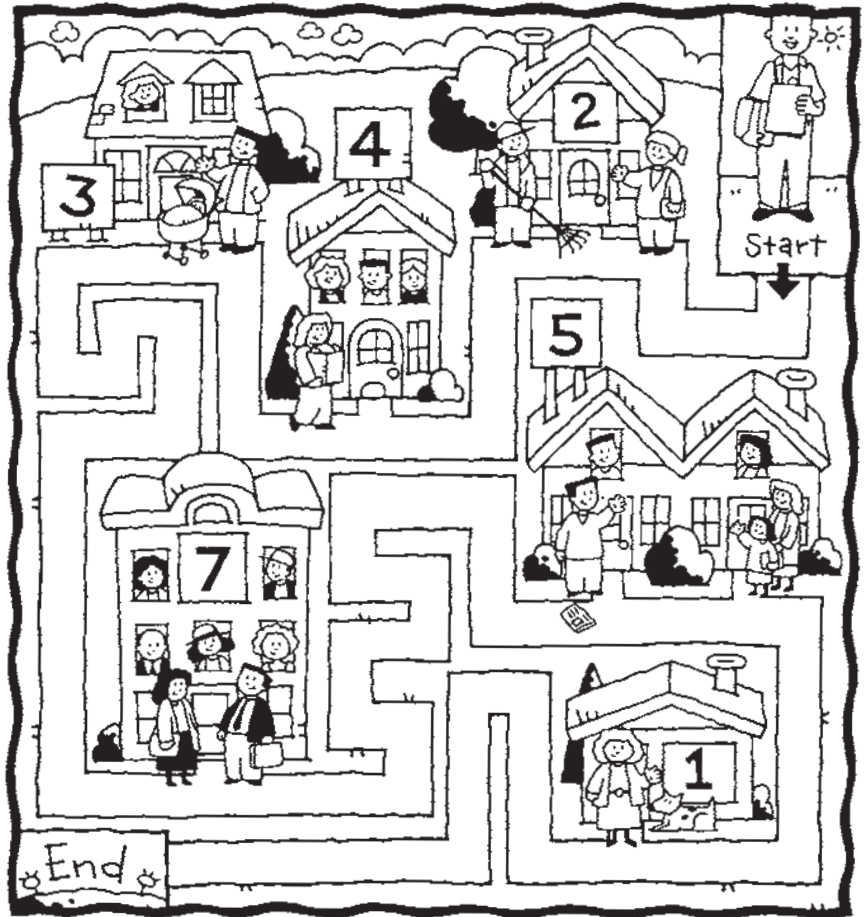


You Count, Too!

1. How many houses did you visit?

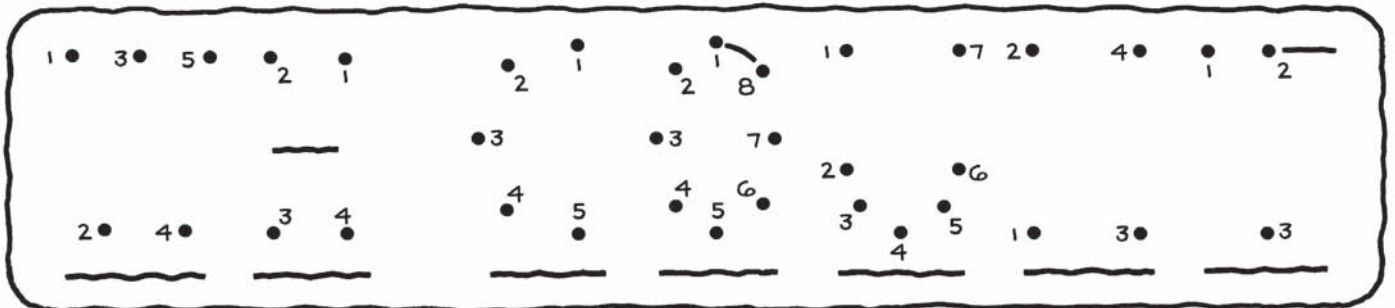
2. How many people did you count?

Connect the Dots

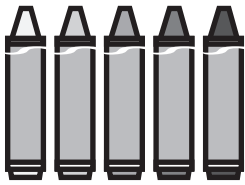
What is the most important part of the 2010 Census? **Connect the dots to find out!**



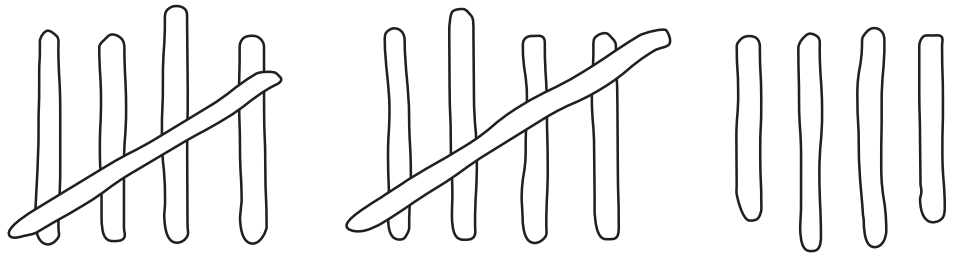

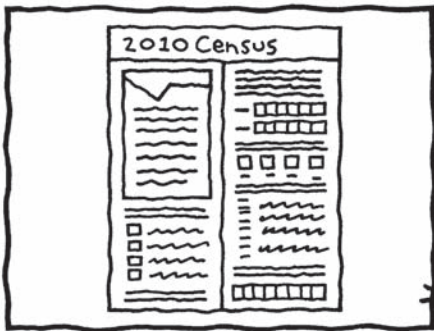
