Two educational publications produced by the <u>Tampa Bay Times Newspaper in</u> <u>Education program</u> have received awards in the 2020 <u>National Newspaper Association Better</u> <u>Newspaper Editorial Contest</u> in the NIE - Partnerships category.

<u>The Palace in the Heart of Tampa</u>, designed by Patty Langgle, won First Place. Dating back to 90 BCE, the hydraulis is a musical instrument with a rich history. From the hydraulis to church organs to the Mighty Wurlitzer, the instrument has had many incarnations. The Mighty Wurlitzer Theatre Organ in Tampa Theatre is a 1,400-pipe instrument, originally installed to accompany silent films when the theater opened in 1926.
