### Talking Points

1. What are these cartoonists saying about the end of Special Counsel Robert Mueller's investigation into Russian interference and the election of President Donald Trump?
2. Did the finding that Trump's campaign did not actively conspire with Russian agents in the 2016 election "totally exonerate" him as he says?
3. How many people were charged with crimes in the probe and who were they?
4. What happens next?
5. How will the investigation impact the 2020 presidential election?
